Dentists-Insurance Company Conflicts

Matthew Wilton is a litigation lawyer called to the Ontario Bar in 1989. A large part of his practice is defending dentists in RCDSO discipline and complaint matters, section 75 investigations, partnership disputes and employment law.

Matthew's presentation will deal with:

- Common mistakes dentists make when billing insurers;
- Cases where dentists have been criticized by their regulator, or convicted of professional misconduct as a result of dishonest or inaccurate billings to insurance companies;
- His experience in acting for dentists who are responding to insurance audits;
- His experience involving disputes between insurers and dentists;
- And the delisting process.

Periodontology

Dr. Hyman obtained his dental degree from the University of Manitoba in 1970. Gary practiced general dentistry from 1970-78 before getting his diploma in periodontology from the University of Oregon.

In the 35 years that Dr. Hyman has been practicing periodontology, he has seen a dramatic change in the way it has evolved. Today, we have so many more tools at our disposal, we can replace hopeless teeth with implants, we can cover recession with grafts from human donor sites and we have regenerative materials that allow us to cure localized periodontal disease.

The ODA Suggested Fee Guide and Dental Plans – What You Need to Know Now

Leslie Redmond is an Assistant Dental Information Officer in the Practice Advisory Services (PAS) department of the ODA. ODA's PAS staff provide technical expertise regarding the use of The ODA Suggested Fee Guide for general practitioners to ODA members and their dental teams. In addition to matters related to procedure codes, staff also provide support and direction to members on dental claims submissions.

This presentation will outline:

- The ODA fee guide and the yearly process;
- How it evolves and adapts to the changing world of dentistry;
- The difference between how insurers and dentists may have differing interpretations and how these issues are resolved.

What's New in Cariology, When to Treat, When to Observe

Dr. John Maggio is assistant professor at the State of University of New York at Buffalo School of Dental Medicine where he supervises students in the predoctoral dental clinic. He is course director of the third year Cariology and Direct Restorations lecture courses. John has developed protocols for caries management and operative dentistry in the school's dental clinics. He is chair of the Curriculum Committee.

Dr. Maggio is a member of CAMBRA and the American Academy of Cariology. He also reviews articles for submission to the Journal of the American Dental Association.

John teaches fast-paced, evidence-based continuing education courses in restorative dentistry and caries management to dentists and their teams.

Dr. Maggio will present the latest evidence and clinical guidelines to support:

- The use of fluoride, based on individual caries risk;
- When to restore a lesion;
- Conservative non-operative treatment of small lesions;
- And avoiding endodontic treatment for deep caries lesions in teeth with healthy pulps.
